

Drawing Dragons

Michael P. White, illustrator of the bestselling book "The Library Dragon," presents this high-energy, interactive program. Children will learn how one idea can start a story and how an author and illustrator work together to bring a story to life. They will also learn the value of persistence and perseverance in following their dreams.

Ronald McDonald "Reading Rangers"

Ronald McDonald will talk to the children about how much fun it is to read and encourage them to read during the summer. He will read stories, perform a magic trick or two, and encourage the children to join "Ronald's Reading Rangers".

Fiddlin' Dan the Mountain Man

This musical romp through the woods encourages the children to work together to create one-of-a-kind stories and songs. The program will include storytelling, fiddling, sing-alongs and mountain lore. Presented by Reuben Haller, musician, clown and storyteller.

"Fun with Electricity"

Mike Clemmons sparks enthusiasm about electricity using a Van der Graaf generator, Jacob's Ladder, plasma pen, plasma globes, magnetic electric core, and high powered magnets.

"Be Counted!"

Presented by the U.S. Census Department, this bilingual program features a clown and stresses the importance of being counted.

MusicAlive!

The musical quintet returns with a special program featuring the music of Johnny Mercer. The musicians will also present a segment on songwriting.

Chad Crews Magical Educator

Chad Crews returns this summer with even more stories and books on all types of bugs. The show includes real snakes, spiders, scorpions, a few Madagascar hissing cockroaches and a giant millipede or two.

DDR Dance-Off

Summer Reading Program

June 1 to Aug. 15, 2009

For all ages up to 18 years old

"Be Creative @ Your Library!"

- 1) VISIT ANY LIVE OAK PUBLIC LIBRARIES BRANCH.** Pick up your Summer Reading Log so you can keep track of your reading.
 - 2) READ ANYTHING!** Paperbacks, magazines, comics, graphic novels, newspapers - not just library books. You can also participate by listening to stories read aloud or by listening to books on tape.
 - 3) READ OR LISTEN FOR A TOTAL OF 15 HOURS.** Complete your 15 hours (*not 15 titles*) June 1 through Aug. 15.
 - 4) KEEP TRACK OF YOUR 15 HOURS.** You can color or check off the "paint splashes" (oval shapes) in your Reading Log. FOUR 15-minute splashes = ONE HOUR of reading or listening.
 - 5) COMPLETED 15 HOURS?** Take your Reading Log to any library branch to get your **FREE PRIZE PACKAGE**, including coupons for special treats and an entry form for prize drawings (while supplies last). Prizes may not be redeemed before June 12.
 - 6) KEEP GOING!** Every time you complete an additional 15 hours, you'll receive another entry form for prize drawings. The more you read, the more entry forms you can submit.
 - 7) BRANCH PRIZE DRAWINGS: AUG. 18.** One prize drawing will be held at each branch for a Barnes & Noble \$25 gift certificate. Entry forms must be submitted by Aug. 15 to qualify.
